IMPORTANT — DOCUMENT TYPE NOTICE

This Allergen Statement identifies fragrance allergens naturally present in this essential oil as defined under EU Cosmetics Regulation (EC) No 1223/2009, Annex III, as amended by Commission Regulation (EU) 2023/1545 (effective 2025). It is intended to assist downstream formulators and brand owners in meeting their labelling and safety obligations for cosmetic and personal care products.

Detected EU-Listed Fragrance Allergens

NO EU-LISTED FRAGRANCE ALLERGENS DETECTED

Based on GC-FID analysis of this batch (ARL Job A26-00-1105, 29 April 2026), **none of the 26+ fragrance allergens listed under Annex III of EU Cosmetics Regulation 1223/2009** (as amended by Commission Regulation 2023/1545) were detected at or above the applicable declaration thresholds in Buddhawood Oil (*Eremophila mitchellii*).

The principal constituents — eremophilone (33.57%), hydroxy eremophilone (26.25%), and hydroxy dihydro eremophilone (14.15%) — are bicyclic sesquiterpene ketones unique to the *Eremophila* genus and are not listed in the EU allergen register.

The following EU Annex III allergens were specifically assessed and confirmed absent above declarable thresholds:

Note: Assessment is based on GC-FID identification. The ~12.95% unidentified balance was not individually characterised. Formulators requiring complete allergen profiling for highly regulated markets should request additional GC-MS analysis.

Allergen Statement

This essential oil is derived from Buddhawood (*Eremophila mitchellii*) and **contains no fragrance allergens listed under EU Cosmetics Regulation 1223/2009, Annex III** above declarable thresholds, based on GC-FID analysis of this batch.

No mandatory allergen label disclosure is required for finished cosmetic products incorporating this oil solely on the basis of EU Annex III fragrance allergens, subject to the analytical limitations noted above.

Safety Advisory

- Although no EU-listed allergens were detected, individual sensitivity to novel sesquiterpene ketone compounds (eremophilone class) cannot be excluded. A patch test is recommended prior to topical application.
- No known skin sensitisation data exists for eremophilone or the other principal constituents. Formulators should conduct their own risk assessment for leave-on skin contact applications.
- Dilute to an appropriate concentration before skin application — do not apply undiluted to skin.
- Not for internal use.
- Keep out of reach of children.
- If irritation occurs, discontinue use and seek medical advice.
- For professional use: refer to the Safety Data Sheet for full handling and hazard information.
